## Step 1: Identify the Behavior & Its Function

- Where does it happen?
- What triggers it?
- Why does the student behave this way?

## Step 2: Prioritize Prevention Strategies

- Build positive relationships.
- Modify the learning environment.
- Reinforce positive behaviors.

## Step 3: Teach Replacement Behaviors

- Instead of yelling → Teach raising a hand
- Instead of leaving the room → Teach requesting a break
- Instead of tantrums → Teach asking for help

## Step 4: Respond Strategically

- Use de-escalation techniques.
- Provide logical consequences.
- Maintain consistency among staff.

## Step 5: Start Small & Build Momentum

- Focus on one behavior at a time.
- Celebrate successes.
- Expand strategies gradually.
